### 2022 - A year of highs and lows



2022 was an eventful year for SALT. We had some really bitter disappointments and many equally wonderful encouragements.

The year could not have got off to a worse start. On 3 Jan, just as we were preparing for our live online broadcast, the thatch-roof msasa at Saidi was struck by lightning. Within minutes it was ablaze and shortly the roof was reduced to smouldering ash. This was a major setback as, although not completely finished, the msasa had already become key to so many of our activities.

The lightning strike heralded the start of a prolonged period of very strong winds and heavy rain as Cyclone Anna swept through the region. Over the next couple of weeks hundreds of thousands of Malawians were displaced as the flood waters rose. Many families in our immediate area suffered real hardship.

By far the greatest disappointment came in early April when sister Anna was attacked and robbed in her home at Zomba. We are so thankful that her life was preserved, and that in the grace of God, she has coped with the

Meanwhile work of translating years 2 & 3 continues. Please pray for this hugely important task, and for the necessary resources to make the lessons widely available to children throughout Malawi.

# The long-awaited return of MGO

The highlight of the year was the resumption of MGO after a two-year hiatus. We had our biggest team ever, with representatives from UK, USA, Canada & Mexico joining the local volunteers.

The Lord blessed us with a wonderful time. We visited 6 schools, 1 prison and several market places for open-air meetings and Seed Sower distribution. Each evening the team returned to Saidi for a Gospel meeting.

However, for many of us, the Children's day-camp was the climax of the fortnight. We planned for 200 youngsters, and 600 came! There was food (miraculously enough for all) and lots of fun. More importantly, 600 children heard and learned the Word of God. It still brings tears of joy to our eyes.

# Relief Work - With your help, SALT continues to support various worthy causes in Malawi.

Every day, we provide a nutritious meal for around 100 orphan refugees In the Dzaleka Camp, and we also contribute to a program to feed street kids and vulnerable women in the capital city, Lilongwe.

Also in Dzaleka, we fund a skills training workshop for refugee foster mothers, where they learn to provide a living for themselves and their children through sewing and embroidery, giving them some propsect of escaping the prostitution-poverty-trap. It would be impossible to overstate the hardship in which these poorest of



the world's poor live. It is a privilege to help sustain them.

During the past year we again helped with repairs and rebuilding homes damaged or destroyed by the cyclone. Extreme weather and extreme poverty are a bad combination. Many Malawians are living in un-fired mud brick houses which simply collapse when exposed to excess wind and rain. (see front page)

Our aim is always to keep the Gospel "Front and Centre" and every such intervention is with a view to the furtherance of the Gospel.



# Outreach Centre Project - Saidi

The impact of MGO is still being felt at Saidi. Numbers attending the weekly Gospel meeting, the midweek Bible study and the children's meetings continue to rise. Several people have expressed interest in Baptism, and we feel the time is nearing when an assembly will be formed there.

We are thankful that once the annual rains passed we were able to complete repairs to the msasa roof and have it back in use again. (see opposite)

Other projects undertaken during 2022 include: construction of a print room and office (doubles up as a studio apartment in the meantime), landscaping to reduce dry-season dust and damaging wet-season runoff across the site, provision of water storage tanks and a septic system.

We felt it prudent to invest in enhanced security measures on site. We installed a personal attack alarm system and a quality CCTV system, although we are having some teething difficulties powering these

purely by solar, as originally planned.

Malawi is plagued by frequent, prolonged power outages (10 hrs+daily) so we have installed a 3KW solar electric system to power our office equipment. As the system is highly scalable, it should be able to cope with future expanding power poods.

As the popularity of these continues to grow, we are planning to add some Portuguese (Mozambique) and Swahili (Dzaleka Refugee Camp) materials during 2023, Lord willing. The expense of producing everincreasing volumes of literature is considerable, and we praise God for the generosity of his people which makes this ministry possible.

Anna & Wati ran two 2-day camps for the Bibletime students at Dzaleka. Although exhausting, it was a great opportunity to teach the children about the purpose of the Lord's coming into the world. As neither speaks Swahili, most of this work is by interpreter.

We are thankful for the Congolese volunteers who regularly teach the Swahili Bibletime groups. It was very encouraging to observe a noticeable improvement in the childrens' (and teachers!) Bible knowledge since they started using Bibletime a little over a year ago.

A similar program was held at Saidi on Christmas Eve, and we also helped with the cost of the Christmas Day program among the Lilongwe Street
